RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is concerned with the survival of the Native Apache Trout, and

WHEREAS, the Apache Trout is unable to survive when competing for habitat with other trout, and

WHEREAS, the Apache Trout must have more and better habitat to survive, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise and the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service will pay any costs incurred in the renovation of Hurricane Lake.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Hurricane Lake be renovated to eliminate all Trout species except for the Native Apache Trout.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that after Hurricane Lake is renovated, it shall be closed to all fishing except for special seasons set up by the White Mountain Apache Recreation Enterprise.

The foregoing resolution was on June 5, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f & i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
