RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is eligible for Tribal Government Improvement Grant through the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and
- WHEREAS, in accordance with the rules governing such funds, the Tribal Council is bound to establish priorities on the expenditure of such monies; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed and discussed the types of tribal projects which may be funded from this grant; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that such funds are greatly needed for the continuation of tribal efforts to renovate the Tribal Government and business area at Whiteriver, known as the "Whiteriver Beautification Project"; and
- WHEREAS, such project would involve the removal of old or unusable buildings, the general clean up of the entire area, the place of sidewalks and the addition of public use area, as currently planned by the Tribe for the centralization and improvement of Tribal Government operations in Whiteriver.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain

 Apache Tribe that it hereby establishes the priority

 for expenditure of 1981 Tribal Government Improvement

 grant funding on the "Whiteriver Beautification

 Project", in the amount of \$125,000.00.

The foregoing resolution was on July 8, 1980, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
