

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is continually concern over the presence of livestock within highway rights-of-way; and
- WHEREAS, such livestock continues to be a threat to human life and personal property; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has previously enacted Ordinance 99 for the purpose of providing a remedy for these problems; and
- WHEREAS, Ordinance 31 additionally has been in effect for the purpose of controlling the number of livestock within the Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, these two ordinances together establish extensive rules on the number, type and location of livestock within the Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has discussed at great length the problems in the lack of enforcement of either of these ordinances; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has further discussed the responsibility for their enforcement and the detriment to the Tribe and tribal members from the failure to enforce them.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe it hereby reaffirms that Ordinance Numbers 31 and 99 are in full force and effect.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all persons or organizations, as applicable, who are charged for these ordinances to enforce them are directed to undertake full enforcement of their respective responsibilities under these ordinances.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the General Livestock Association Manager is specifically directed to enforce Ordinance 99 in accordance with his responsibilities therein.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that persons or organizations' responsibilities for enforcing these ordinances who refuse to do so shall be held accountable to the Tribal Council.


The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1980, duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 3 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
