RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache youth of today are the leaders of tomorrow; and
- WHEREAS, youth problems including school droupouts, delinquency, alcohol abuse, and drugs are on the increase on the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, several tribal programs, including Land Claims Recreation, Tribal Guidance Center, and JOM, have placed a priority on resolving these problems through recreation and related kinds of activities; and
- WHEREAS, the recreational facilities of both East Fork and Seven-Mile Communities are inadequate to meet the needs of local youth; and
- WHEREAS, the basketball courts in both communities require rebuilding, expansion, and additional equipment in order to provide maximum community use.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe approve the allocation of revenue sharing funds in the amount of \$18,950.00 for the communities of East Fork and Seven Mile for the purpose of paying and lighting at the community basketball courts as per bid of White Mountain Apache Development Enterprise.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution No. 79-181 is hereby reaffirmed.

The foregoing resolution was on July 9, 1980, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
