RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised that Public Law 95-561 authorizes the creation of a Bureau of Indian Affairs Agency School Board, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been requested to select such Agency School Board membership, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that such membership should consist of individuals who are responsive to educational needs and interests, and who are qualified to carry out the important obligations in the best interest of the Tribe and tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed and discussed nominees for membership on the proposed Agency School Board, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that five (5) members on such board would be appropriate, and
- WHEREAS, it is intended that the new School Board be activated as of October 1, 1980.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby appoints to the position of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Agency School Board the following individuals, effective August 7, 1980:

The foregoing resolution was on August 7, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of $\frac{7}{2}$ for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
