RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is concerned for the accessibility to tribal buildings by handicapped tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that federal law has required proper access ramps, or other appropriate remedies to physical barriers to the handicapped, be provided in federal construction projects, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires that all tribal buildings or facilities be made easily accessible to all handicapped members of the Tribe by the removal of any physical barriers to such access.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that all tribal buildings and facilities be altered or constructed so as to remove any physical barriers to access for the handicapped.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that existing tribal buildings shall be altered to comply with this resolution as soon as possible with proper budgetary procedure.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that future tribal buildings shall be planned and constructed to comply with this resolution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Central Tribal Business Office and the Tribal Planning Office are directed to take all appropriate actions to enforce this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on August 7, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
