RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is concerned that the rapid population growth on the White Mountain Apache Indian Reservation requires an orderly expansion of Tribal Law and Order capabilities so as to ensure justice and due process for Tribal citizens and tranquility on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that the orderly development of the necessary law and order capability requires a long-range plan carefully developed by realistic analysis of future needs, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the directors and key personnel of social and justice programs on the reservation strongly support the planning and development of on-reservation programs and facilities to deal with the problems of troubled juveniles and youth, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further advised that under Public Law 93-638, funds are available through the Bureau of Indian Affairs for such long-range planning.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby approves a program of long-range planning for the future growth and expansion of the Tribal Law Enforcement and Judicial Systems (with emphasis on the needs of juveniles and youth) to meet the needs of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for at least ten (10) years in the future; and funds for such planning are to be obtained under Public Law 93-638 from the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is authorized to take all such actions as may be required to carry out the purposes of this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on February 07, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
