

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe operates a Tribal Employment Rights Office, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been informed of a recent decision of the Tribal Employment Rights Office Director in the case of Scotty Tenijieth, pursuant to Tribal Employment Rights Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, said decision orders Pinetop Logging to pay backpay to Scotty Tenijieth, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further informed that Pinetop Logging, to date, has not complied with said order, and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised of the sanctions for non-compliance provided for in the Tribe's adopted Ordinance and has been requested to consider such available sanction, against Pinetop Logging, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council reviewed and considered the determinations made by the Tribal Employment Rights Office Director and circumstances of non-compliance by Pinetop Logging.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs its Tribal Employment Rights Office Director to secure compliance with its orders to pay backpay, pursuant to the Tribal Employment Rights Office Ordinance, in the case of Scotty Tenijieth vs. Pinetop Logging, by taking all actions as are appropriate

The foregoing resolution was on September 11, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
