

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised and aware that the Bureau of Indian Affairs provides to the Tribe Agricultural Assistance Program by contract with the University of Arizona, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is informed that the purposes of this program were to provide community education training, and related activities to individuals on the reservation in matters of farming, ranching, Home Economics, and other activities, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that these purposes serve the best interest of the Tribe and tribal members and is strongly desired by the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is concerned that the current Extension Agent in charge of the Agricultural Extension Program is non-responsive to the needs of the Tribe or tribal members; does not perform the purposes of the program; nor provides the community activities hereinabove described, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further finds that continued presence of said Extension Agent threatens the viability of the Extension Program and the purposes it is intended to serve, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires that the Extension Agent, Calvin Emerson, be removed from such position on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the University of Arizona to remove Calvin Emerson from his position of Extension Agent under the Agricultural Extension Program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation by and for reasons hereinabove stated and to replace him with a capable and responsive individual to fulfill the purposes of the program as soon as possible.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is requested to assist the Tribe in fulfilling the purposes of this Resolution.


The foregoing resolution was on September 11, 1980 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
