

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe by enactment of Resolution No. 80-286 has denied the enrollment requests of an applicant, Ms. Lynn Martha Hitt; and

WHEREAS, all of the surrounding circumstances and information upon which such council action has been taken leads the Tribal Council to believe that misrepresentation, fraud, or other wrong doing has been perpetrated upon the tribe and,

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further finds that such conduct of the applicant, and the subsequent enrollment denial have cause emotional injury and humiliation to the family whom said applicant claimed to be a member; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires that the applicant in this instance, as well as other potential applicants, who intentionally abuse tribal members and the Tribe by undertaking such fraud in enrollment requests should be deterred from such conduct.

BE IT RESOLVED BY the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes and directs the Tribal Legal Department to take all appropriate action necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on November 5, 1980, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
