RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe feels that it is necessary to develop a policy for tribally-owned vehicles due to misuse of tribal cars and credit cards, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is responsible for tribal funds and tribal equipment.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the following policy is hereby approved for all tribal departments, that is assigned a tribal vehicle; except for the Tribal Chairman and the Vice-Chairman.

- 1. No tribal vehicle is to be used for personal business.
- 2. Credit cards are not to be utilized for personal vehicles.
- 3. Mileage shall not be paid to individuals for use of tribal vehicles.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Whiteriver Police Department is hereby directed to assist with the enforcement of this policy by stopping all tribal vehicles after working hours and on weekends, and if individuals do not have a written authorization from the respective department head, he/she is to be charged with misusing tribal property, and if found guilty, shall be subject to disciplinary action.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all tribal vehicles are to be immediately identified as property of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the effective date of enforcement of this resolution shall be January 08, 1981.

The foregoing resolution was on January 08, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
