FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires to establish a committee consisting of representatives from each community on the reservation for the purpose of obtaining a F.C.C. license to rebroadcast television programs by translators.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby establishes the White Mountain Apache Translator Association to fulfill the requirements for obtaining a F.C.C. license.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following members of the Governing Body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe are hereby appointed to the association to represent the communities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the above Governing Body be authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on January 08, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
