

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to reinstate Mrs. Bessie Quintero to a position with the Head Start organization, and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Bessie Quintero has requested of the Tribal Council assistance to secure her fifteen years employment with the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and


WHEREAS, the Parent Policy Council has informed the Tribal Council that said employee was being transferred since she did not meet the time frame requirement to acquire the Child Development Associate (CDA) credential as declared by Tribal Council mandate as set forth in Resolution No. 79-21 dated February 07, 1979, and


WHEREAS, the Parent Policy Council of the White Mountain Apache Head Start recognizes Mrs. Bessie Quintero as a valuable asset who could contribute to the Apache cultural program for the children of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and therefore recommends that she be appointed to work as an Apache Cultural Specialist for the White Mountain Apache Head Start Cultural Resource Center.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes \$3,000.00 for the remainder of the 1980/1981 Tribal Fiscal year to allow Mrs. Bessie Quintero the opportunity to work in the Apache Cultural Resource Center.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the primary purpose of the Cultural Resource Center would be to further strengthen the development of self-esteem in Apache children through instruction in their language, customs, and culture.

The foregoing resolution was on February 05, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
