## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the quality and quantity of health services provided to Indian people through Indian Health Service have traditionally been limited and insufficient to meet the existing health care needs, and
- WHEREAS, historically, Indian people have had to resist the encroachment of non-Indians into the lands, resources and rights of Indian people.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it formally opposes the proposed changes to Title 42, Subpart B, Part 36, paragraphs (a) 36.12 Code of Federal Regulations that would expand the eligibility for Indian Health Services to include non-Indian husbands and other non-Indians residing in Indian household.

The foregoing resolution was on February 05, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
