RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been presented with the matter of the verbal resignation of Mr. Rudy Ethelbah from his managerial position at Hondah, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised by Rudy Ethelbah that he wishes to withdraw his resignation and the Tribal Council having reviewed and considered at length, the available information surrounding his purported resignation in the operations of the Apache Enterprise, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that said employee has provided his service and experience to the Tribe and is willing to serve the Tribe as a tribal employee which warrants consideration for a successful Enterprise.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Rudy Ethelbah be reinstated to his managerial position at Hondah, that he be allowed to withdraw his resignation, and that he get together with the Manager of the Enterprise for the purpose of resolving managerial differences and report accordingly the progress made toward the resolution of those differences to the Tribal Council at a future date.

The foregoing resolution was on April 03, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
