

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Apache Radio Broadcasting Corporation has been informed that the current Reagan Administration has proposed a rescission on NTIA's Public Telecommunications Facilities Program, and

WHEREAS, if NTIA's PTEF is rescinded, approximately two million dollars program money will be lost this year by the Indian people. Indian projects have a very good chance of qualifying for program funds since they receive points for both minority and first-service-to area preference, and

WHEREAS, the Apache Radio Broadcasting Corporation has diligently and enthusiastically worked on developing a FM Public Radio Station on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation since February, 1979, and

WHEREAS, a tremendous amount of time and money has been invested into the planning of a FM Public Radio Station, and

WHEREAS, the Apache Radio Broadcasting Corporation Board of Directors strongly recommends to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to support the lobbying effort to ensure maximum protection for the continuation of NTIA's Public Telecommunications Facilities Program.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it supports the Apache Radio Broadcasting Corporation in adamantly opposing the proposed budget rescission of Public Telecommunications Facilities Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby opposes any actions that would result in the elimination of Public Telecommunications Facilities Program.


