RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been advised that monies allocated to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development will be severely cut back by the Administration in the new Budget, and
- WHEREAS, this will severely curtail the availability of funds for construction of needed housing for tribal members on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, there is a dire need for adequate housing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council believes that it is in the best interest of the tribal members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman of the Tribe be directed to testify before Congress and to otherwise lobby against the proposed cut backs.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe is hereby directed to lobby against the proposed
 cut back of HUD funds, including but not limited to
 travelling to Washington, D. C. to testify before the
 Congressional Committees and to meet with HUD and other
 Government Officials for that purpose.

The foregoing resolution was on April 07, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
