

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, prior to the construction of Route 48 a Memorandum of Agreement was entered into between the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, Bureau of Indian Affairs and the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, this Memorandum of Agreement requires a twenty-year recording/monitoring program for twelve (12) archaeological sites in the vicinity of Route 48, and

WHEREAS, the Division of External Archaeological Programs of the National Park Service has requested permission to conduct the monitoring program during the months of June and July, 1981, 1982, 1983 and 1984.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the National Park Service is hereby authorized to monitor the twelve (12) archaeological sites as discussed in the Memorandum of Agreement as concurred in by the Tribal Chairman on July 24, 1978.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the National Park Service shall notify the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Bureau of Indian Affairs during the month of May of each year when they plan to be on the Reservation.


The foregoing resolution was on May 14, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
