RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been advised by the Director of the Recreation Enterprise that Tonto Lake has had very little use by tribal members for fishing purposes; and
- WHEREAS, the Recreation Enterprise is in need of more revenue in order to achieve a greater profit margin; and
- WHEREAS, the excellent fishing at Tonto Lake could generate added revenues for the Department if opened up to Non-tribal members on a restricted basis.
- BE IT RESOLVED that Tonto Lake be opened to fishing by non-tribal members on Friday, Saturday and Sunday's but limited to fifty permits per day.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a Special Fee for fishing at Tonto Lake be set at five dollars (\$5.00) per day per fisherman for all non-tribal members in addition to annual or daily permits otherwise required.

The foregoing resolution was on June 2, 1981, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) and (h) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
