## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to the welfare and improvement of the health, education and well-being of its members, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes the contribution that sports including swimming, make to the health, education and well-being of its members, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a large, and well-equipped swimming pool, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe encourages the increased use of its community swimming pool for health, education, well-being and profit, and
- WHEREAS, the Water Quality Management Planning Department is sponsoring its First Annual Thousand Meter All-Swimmer Meet which ALL swimmers may enter at no charge to be held at the Whiteriver Swimming Pool on Saturday afternoon August 8, 1981 from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.; for which swimmers may use any stroke and speed and all finishers will receive a Certificate.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby declares that it supports this event in both its initiation and continuation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby encourages all swimmers to participate in this Meet and all non-swimmers either to become swimmers (learn to swim) or to support the event in any way they are able.

The foregoing resolution was on July 2, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 2 against and 0 abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i & h) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
