

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the old U. S. Public Health Service Hospital in Whiteriver can be granted to the White Mountain Apache Tribe only through the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs requires a special Tribal Council Resolution indicating a continuing Tribal interest in securing use of the facility.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Council indicates it does indeed need the facility as office space, but not limited to office space, for various tribal programs; and desires to secure permanent use of it from the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The foregoing resolution was on July 15, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
