## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct a new paved road along the present alignment of Route 42 from Route 44, Sawmill Road to the New Fairgrounds Junction, as well as a new paved road to the location of the Agriculatural Enterprise in Canyon Day, and
- WHEREAS, the tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way from the beginning of the project at Route 44, 100 feet in width and 1.124 miles in length, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to consider construction of a paved road serving the Agricultural Farm Enterprise in Canyon Day, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is also requested to provide the necessary surveys and request for Right-of-Way.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous Right-of-Way as recorded on a map on file in the Office of the Superintendent, Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made.

The foregoing resolution was on August 6, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
