RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been advised by Ramon Riley, Director of the Apache Radio Station taht the present proposed site for the Tribal Radio Station and tower will be interfered with by powerlines interfering with the broadcast, and
- WHEREAS, the Director of the Apache Radio Station has suggested an alternative site adjacent to the Fish and Game Building, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council sees no objection to the proposed alternative radio station site.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that permission is hereby granted for the reasons stated above for the Tribal Radio Station to relocate the site of its proposed radio station.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Director,
 Ramon Riley, of the Tribal Radio Station, is hereby directed
 to obtain a description of the site from Raymus Albert,
 Chairman of the Land Board Assignment Committee to be
 included and attached to this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on September 9, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
