RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been presented with a list of candidates for the position of Area Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Area Office located in Phoenix, Arizona, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has discussed extensively, the attributes and character of the candidates presented to it for review for said position, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is in unanimous agreement that Mr. Jose A. Zuni possesses outstanding attributes and can do much to assist Indian Tribes in the State of Arizona if he were appointed for Phoenix Area Director for the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it unanimously and strongly endorses the appointment of Jose A. Zuni to the position of Phoenix Area Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it directs the Chairman of the Tribal Council to notify Mr. Ken Smith, Assistant Secretary Indian Affairs of this unanimous resolution of the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on October 27, 1981 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
