

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised by Sherwin Heaton, a representative from the Farmers Home Administration, that because of the untimely death of Brenda (Lavender) Ethelbah and the imprisonment of Roger Ethelbah who formerly were in the process of purchasing a house through the F.H.A.; and

WHEREAS, Sherwin Heaton advises the Tribal Council that continued payment on the house is impossible because of the untimely death and Roger Ethelbah's imprisonment and that the F.H.A. needs a Tribal Council resolution to revert the home back to the F.H.A. so that it may be renovated and made available to the tribal members for purchase; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that the request of the F.H.A. is supported by good cause.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the house purchased by the deceased, Brenda (Lavender) Ethelbah and her husband, Roger Ethelbah revert back to the Farmers Home Administration for purposes of renovation and preparation of the house for future tribal purchasers.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this copy of the resolution be mailed to Sherwin Heaton as soon as it is approved.


