RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the disease of alcoholism is the primary health problem of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, preventative efforts in the form of community education on alternatives to the alcoholic life style and alcoholic patterns of drinking are critical elements in the long range approach to decreasing the problems of alcoholism, and

WHEREAS, alcoholism is part of the larger problem of drug abuse.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
Tribe supports the efforts of the White Mountain Alcohol and
Substance Abuse Task Force to develop and implement a recurring
yearly program of alcohol and drug abuse education for the
Reservation communities and schools using whatever media and
educational means available.

The foregoing resolution was on January 6, 1982, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (r,s,t) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
