

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct a new paved road to the new Tribal fairgrounds, and

WHEREAS, a gravel pit is required, and

WHEREAS, the gravel pit number 8435 located on Whiteriver which was established by the Arizona Highway Department and the lease has expired is requested for use by the Bureau of Indian Affairs for this project, and


WHEREAS, the pit site is behind Roger Ethelbah's new home, and

WHEREAS, the gravel pit will be cleaned and sloped after use.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is hereby granted permission to remove gravel by contract and that the royalty is hereby waived in lieu of benefits received.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Roads Construction Enterprise be given every opportunity to bid on these contracts.

The foregoing resolution was on February 03, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
