RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has undated its Road Construction priorities, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Roads and Forestry Committees have set its projects as follows:
 - 1. Whiteriver Fairgrounds and paving housing access road in the Whiteriver, RAinbow City and Diamond Creek area.
 - 2. Canyon Day Farm Road.
 - 3. Route 60, Firebox to Hawley Lake.
 - 4. Route 61, Diamond Creek to Route 60.
 - 5. Oak Creek Road.
 - 6. Route 55 Rock Creek Route 8.
 - 7. Upper Cibecue Bridge.
 - 8. Route 70, Seven-Mile, I.D. Ranch. 9. Route 48, Bootleg-Forestdale.

 - 10. Cibecue-Grasshopper, Route 12.
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe requests that Bureau of Indian Affairs construct roads as the priorities are listed, and
- WHEREAS, the priorities may be changed at any time by the Committee and the Tribal Council.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the above recommendation.
- BE IT FURIHER RESOLVED that the committee seriously reconsider priorities to cover much needed roads that are used daily, particularly with roads in areas involved in our water rights developments.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Roads Construction Program be assisted by the Bureau of Indian Affairs Roads Department to participate in the construction of the above prioritized request.

The foregoing resolution was on February 03, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
