


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Delbert Altaha has advised the Tribal Council that his son was assaulted and suffered physical injuries as a result of said assault and battery upon his person which occurred outside the exterior boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and was committed upon his person by a non-Indian, and


WHEREAS, Delbert Altaha request of the Tribal Council that the Tribal Attorney assist him and his son in advising them of the proper preparation for the criminal case against the defendant non-Indian who assaulted his son and to explore the possibilities of filing a Civil Suit for damages for the injuries resulting to his son which are grave and may be permanent, and good cause appearing for said request.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Attorney is hereby directed to meet and discuss with Delbert Altaha and his son the possibility of filing a Civil Complaint for personal injuries suffered by Delbert Altaha's son as a result of the illegal assault and battery committed upon his person by a non-Indian outside the reservation boundaries.

The foregoing resolution was on February 05, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (d, t and u) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
