RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the community people from Carrizo have appeared before the Tribal Council and complained about the social problems resulting from the sale of spirituous beverages from the Carrizo Service Station, and
- WHEREAS, the people of Carrizo have also complained about the lack of police enforcement by the Tribal Police Officers due to friend-ships and relationships between the tribal-member police officers and persons to whom law enforcement should be directed and; therefore, request a non-Indian police without such ties, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after lengthy discussion at this Council Meeting and at previous Council Meetings, is of the opinion that the complaints of the Carrizo people are substantial and well-documented and finding good cause for their request.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Apache Enterprise to suspend all sales of spirituous beverages from the Carrizo Service Station within the next ten (10) days of the date of this resolution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Apache Enterprise is directed to remove all spirituous beverages from the Carrizo Service Station within the next ten (10) days from the date of this resolution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Tribal Police Chief, Reno Johnson or his designated representative is hereby requested to immediately assign a non-Indian Police Officer to the Carrizo Community and to further meet with the community people in order to work out a satisfactory plan for police protection and for adequate law enforcement for the Carrizo Community.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that persons with alcoholic sickness who will be affected by the suspension of the sale of spirituous beverages in Carrizo be assisted by the Detox Center in arranging for their treatment and transportation to and from the Detox Center and to otherwise meet the community problems resulting from the sudden unavailbility of spirituous beverages to those persons who are seriously affected by alcoholic disease.

The foregoing resolution was on March 03, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
