

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Tribal Police Chief Reno Johnson has requested that the Tribal Council approve his budget of radio communication equipment to be worn by individual police officers while on duty, and

WHEREAS, Police Chief, Reno Johnson has advised the Tribal Council that the serious wounds suffered by Ralph Lupe, Sr. could have been avoided if he had the use of individual communication equipment in order to call for officer assistance, and

WHEREAS, it was fortunate that Ralph Lupe, Sr. was discovered in a wounded state by a fellow officer before and after more serious and complications occurred, and

WHEREAS, the cost of the equipment is relatively small in comparison to the security and safety which will be provided for the members of the Police Force.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the request of Reno Johnson for the purchase radio communication equipment for the Police Department for the reasons set forth herein.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said radio communication equipment shall be purchased from Revenue Sharing funds, which according to Reno Johnson are available for this purpose.


