## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, through its Office of Education, maintains a boarding school, called, "Theodore Roosevelt School" at Fort Apache, Arizona on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that the school is going through a period of reduced enrollment, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires that the school be kept in operation for the betterment of its children, and
- WHEREAS, funding at the Theodore Roosevelt School is dependent on enrollment as prescribed in Public Law 95-561, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council would like to have the enrollment increased.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that every effort be made by the Bureau of Indian Affairs to actively start a campaign to recruit students here on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and if necessary, extend this campaign to other agencies and tribal groups.

The foregoing resolution was on March 17, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
