
RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, Mr. Ron Malfara, General Manager of the Sunrise Ski Complex, has presented his 1982-83 Fiscal Year Budget to the Tribal Council for their approval, and
- WHEREAS, the Sunrise Budget was moved to be approved by Councilman Ernie Crocker and seconded by Adam Lupe, and
- WHEREAS, said motion to approve the Sunrise Ski Complex Budget was not carried by a majority of the Tribal Council and; therefore, defeated, and
- WHEREAS, Councilmen, Phillip Stago, Jr., Reno Johnson, Sr., West Anderson, Sr. and Alvino Hawkins, Sr. objected to the passage of the Sunrise Budget because questions as to who was going to perform the construction work for the proposed Sunrise expansion and because of further questions as to whether or not there were tribal funds available to finance Sunrise Ski Area's \$635,000.00 operating budget as well as additional monies to be loaned to Sunrise for the installation of the new chair lift, and
- WHEREAS, it's the majority conclusion of the Tribal Council that the same need for a budget clarification and availability of tribal funds will be raised for each fourteen (14) Tribal Enterprises now existing, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council directs Mr. Marcelo Minjarez, Tribal Administrative Manager, to compile facts and figures pertaining to the availability of tribal funds to meet the operating expenses and needs of all of the enterprises and further, directs the Administrative Manager to produce, for the Tribal Council, the amount of monies held by the Tribe in the Treasury and in Time Certificates Deposit and savings, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council requires that this information be provided to it prior to approving the budgets for the fourteen (14) enterprises as well as the Central Tribe Budget, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Fiscal Year terminated on April 30, 1982, and unless authorization is given by way of a continuing resolution on expenditures of money for payroll and otherwise for the fourteen (14) Tribal Enterprises and Central Tribe must terminate midnight, April 30, 1982, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that pending its final approval of Tribal Budget 82-83 Fiscal Year, that it is necessary to pass a continuing resolution allowing all enterprises and Central Tribe to be allowed one-twelfth (1/12th) of their 82-83 budget in order to continue their operations.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that the Administrative Manager, Marcelo Minjarez, present an accurate accounting of funds available in the Tribal Treasury, Time Certificates of Deposit and savings accounts which are available to be appropriated for the Central Tribe Budget and the fourteen (14) Tribal Enterprises.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby allocates to the Central Tribe and the fourteen (14) Tribal Enterprises, the sum equal to 1/12th of the operating 82-83 budget for said enterprises and the Central Tribe pending final approval by the Tribal Council of the 1982-83 Budgets.

The foregoing resolution was on April 27, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 5 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
