## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to assume increased responsibility for Federal social service programs, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been informed that P. L. 93-638 grant funds may be made available for increasing Tribal capability for administering these programs, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has considered a proposal to evaluate Bureau of Indian Affairs social service programs as an initial step to assuming this increased responsibility.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman is authorized to negotiate and execute a 93-638 contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for this purpose.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this contract should commence on or before September 1, 1982 and extend for a period of one year.

The foregoing resolution was on June 02, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
