

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Forestry Committee has reviewed the Biological Evaluation of the U. S. Forest Service on the Spruce Bark Beetle infestation on the Reservation and the Bureau's recommendation of April 26, 1982, and


WHEREAS, there is a very serious problem to the Tribal resource in the spruce area, and


WHEREAS, the Forestry Committee recommends that the recommendations proposed be utilized in 1982 Fort Apache Timber Company logging.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs proceed to:

1. Use Carbaryl insecticide in the Sunrise Ski Complex Area per EPA and U. S. Fish & Wildlife guidelines.
2. Selective cut infested trees in cut over spruce stands (Sunrise, Mount Ord and Bull Cienega Logging areas) and charge Fort Apache Timber Company stumpage under the Reservation Salvage Sale.
3. No more falling or road building will be done in Hurricane Logging Unit and in the Tribal Wilderness - No action option.

The foregoing resolution was on June 14, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
