RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to a long-term program for development of irrigated agriculture and the improvement and protection of its valuable rangelands and forestry resources; and
- WHEREAS, there are constraints in the Federal budget that impede the progress essential to the orderly development of the Tribe's natural resources, including its water rights.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council hereby approves a program of research designed to identify and evaluate potential sources of funding from private sources for the development of the natural resources of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; the results of such research to be submitted to the Tribal Council with appropriate recommendations.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman be authorized and directed to take all necessary actions to carry out the intent of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on August 13, 1982, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section , of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
