

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, several tribal members from Cibecue who are employed as log cutters for the Cibecue Sawmill, a subsidiary of Fort Apache Timber Company, have come before the Tribal Council with several complaints about their Supervisor, a non-tribal member by the name of Thomas Stevenson, and

WHEREAS, these complaints are that Mr. Stevenson has no concern for the welfare, safety and lives of tribal members over which he exercises supervisory authority and has otherwise demonstrated a complete lack of respect and concern for them as human beings, and

WHEREAS, said loggers further complained that Mr. Stevenson shows much greater concern for the welfare of the equipment than the men under his supervision and that his performance as a supervisor is very unsatisfactory due to his lack of feeling and inability to communicate with his loggers, and

WHEREAS, the loggers request that the Tribal Council direct Fort Apache Timber Company Manager, Hal Butler, to fire Mr. Stevenson before the loggers suffer more injuries and insults, and



WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware of the Plan of Operations for Fort Apache Timber Company, but also is quite concerned regarding the charges being made by the loggers against Mr. Stevenson concludes that Fort Apache Timber Company General Manager should immediately investigate these charges.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Fort Apache Timber Company Manager, Hal Butler, to conduct an immediate investigation into the charges being made today against Mr. Thomas Stevenson, the Supervisor at the Cibecue Sawmill.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that Mr. Butler is directed to interview the tribal members involved and Mr. Stevenson and obtain the substance of the complaints and report back to the Tribal Chairman within thirty (30) days of the outcome of his investigation and the disciplinary action, if any is warranted, taken against Mr. Stevenson.

The foregoing resolution was on November 03, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
