RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Associate Professor, J. Jefferson Reid of the University of Arizona, has come before the Tribal Council and requested from the Tribal Council that it renew the Grasshopper lease so that the University of Arizona can continue its Archaeological and Anthropological Research of what has come to be known as the Grasshopper Ruins, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after considerable discussion, with Mr. Reid concludes that Mr. Reid's request should be granted with the condition that all digging activities and research conducted by the University of Arizona be restricted to five acres and no more, and that all digging and exploration shall remain strictly within the present confines or boundaries of the lease.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants the request of the University of Arizona, acting through J. Jefferson Reid for a renewal of the Grasshopper Ruins Lease for a period of five years with the condition that the University of Arizona confine its digging activities to the area of five acres comprising the Grasshopper site.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it directs the Tribal Attorney to review the Grasshopper Lease to insure that the conditions of this resolution are incorporated therein.

The foregoing resolution was on December 01, 1982 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
