## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, American Multiple Industries, located at 1899 Nordhoff Street, Northridge, California 91324, manufactures a X-rated video game entitled "Custer's Revenge" in which an unclothed non-Indian male figure crosses a desert to "ravish" an Indian woman; and
- WHEREAS, said video game insults and contributes to the dominant culture's lack of respect and oppression of Indian people, specifically Indian women; and
- WHEREAS, said video game depicts a violent act of tying an Indian woman to a post and doing injury and insult to her; and
- WHEREAS, said video game is invidiously racist and exploits for monetary gain an immoral and racist ideology directed against Indian people and should be condemned and removed from the market by the manufacturer.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
  Tribe that it hereby condemns the X-rated video game
  entitled "Custer's Revenge" and further protests its
  sale and distribution because of its inherent and invidious
  racist and violent theme which can only contribute to
  further insult and injury and oppression of Indian women
  and Indian people.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOVED by the Tribal Council that a copy of this resolution be sent to the manufacturer, American Multiple Industries and to vendors of said video game.

The foregoing resolution was on January 7, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
