RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, there is an urgent and rapidly growing need for repair and replacement of interior and division fencing in all of the Reservation Cattle Associations, and
- WHEREAS, the ACP Agency of the U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has made available for rangeland and fencing improvements up to \$107,000.00 to be used by the Reservation Livestock Associations, provided that the Associations can invest 35% of total project cost, (in cash or in kind) to match a 65% contribution by ACP, and
- WHEREAS, there is a present balance of \$31,113.36 for rangeland improvement in the Central Tribal Account (No. 01-00-45XX), to be utilized by the respective associations, and
- WHEREAS, there is in the possession of the Tribal Land Operations Department a supply of fencing materials with a value of \$20,614.00 which is available for sale to the associations for use as in-kind matching resources for the ACP funding.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes:
 - 1. The release of funds in the amount of \$31,113.36 for use as matching funds for the ACP Project (detailed list attached; and
 - 2. Sale of fencing materials (detailed list attached) to the livestock associations, payment to the Tribe to be made from funds received from the ACP matching share as it is collected by the associations.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the above-commitment be contingent upon the signing of a final agreement by the livestock associations with the ACP Agency.

The foregoing resolution was on January 18, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
