RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Delbert Zahgotah, Sr., a tribal member, came before the Governing Body and requested tribal assistance for a decent dwelling for himself, and
- WHEREAS, he advised that over a year ago he lost his house in a fire which also took the life of a tribal member, and while attempting to rescue said person, he received bad burns on his hands, arms and feet that kept him from seeking employment and is still unemployed, and
- WHEREAS, presently, he does not have a home of any kind, but must live with relatives, and
- WHEREAS, a two-room house would be adequate to meet his needs, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after discussing and realizing the needs of Mr. Zahgotah, agree that since he is also unemployed, he should be assisted with some hog lumber and the Tribal Work Experience Program crew to assist him with the building of his house.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that hog lumber from Fort Apache Timber Company be used; and that the TWEP Director, Adam Lupe, is directed to avail his crew to assist Mr. Zahgotah in the building of a two-room, suitable dwelling.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Reno Johnson, Sr., Vice-Chairman is directed to coordinate the construction of this house with whatever available materials or assistance that he can get for Mr. Zahgotah.

The foregoing resolution was on March 15, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
