


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Housing Commission has advised the Tribal Council that progress on approval for the construction of 100 HUD homes is dependent on the development of an acceptable Housing Management Improvement Plan, and
- WHEREAS, the acceptability of the Management Improvement Plan is dependent on putting procedures in place that will insure that payroll deductions from delinquent tenants are applied to the Housing Authority's Delinquent Accounts, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Court has not, in all cases, utilized the Federal payroll deduction forms for delinquent tenants that are employed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Indian Health Service or other federal agencies, and
- WHEREAS, due to the present priority order for assigning payroll deductions to various creditors, the Housing Authority often receives little or no payroll deduction to be applied to delinquent accounts, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that it is in the best interest of the people of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to reorder payroll deduction priorities so that the Housing Authority enjoys first priority for delinquent accounts only.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it respectfully requests that the Tribal Court utilize the federal payroll deduction forms for all federal employees adjudged by the Tribal Court to be in a delinquent status to the Housing Authority.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council directs the Tribal Administrative Manager to reorder the priority of payroll deductions, placing the Housing Authority deduction first on those individuals identified by the Housing Authority as being in a delinquent status.

The foregoing resolution was on March 15, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
