RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, representatives of the Cedar Creek Community have come before the Tribal Council with a request for funding to improve their community building for education and community activity, and
- WHEREAS, specifically, the Cedar Creek Community is requesting Revenue Sharing funds or Tribal funds, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council advises the Cedar Creek Community representatives there are presently no tribal funds available to improve the Cedar Creek Community Building which they are advised would cost approximately \$60,000. for labor and materials and further; that there are no Revenue Sharing funds available either because of prior commitments of those funds, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council advises the Cedar Creek Community that there may be other federal funding sources that could be explored which would provide the necessary monies for the improvement.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that it hereby advises the Cedar Creek Community
 representatives that it will direct the appropriate tribal
 government personnel to explore possible sources of federal
 funding in order to obtain funds to improve the Cedar Creek
 Community Building for the purposes described above.

The foregoing resolution was on May 04, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
