RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the position of Tribal Safety Director is of vital importance to the development and enforcement of health and safety policies and procedures and the protection of Tribal lives and property, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is requested to fund, in the FY 1983/84 Tribal Budget, the position of Safety Director, and
- WHEREAS, the close relationship between safety and the Tribal Insurance Program requires a close coordination between the Safety Director and the Tribal Administrative Office so as to reduce damage and injury claims by promoting an active and effective safety program; further coordination also required in the investigation, evaluation and filing of claims on behalf of the Tribe and its employees.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the incumbent Safety Director be assigned to the Tribal Administrative Office with direct responsibility to the Administrative Manager for the diligent performance of all Tribal Safety functions and such other risk management matters as the Administrative Manager may assign; a functional statement and a job description to be developed and put into effect by the Administrative Manager within sixty (60) days from date.

The foregoing resolution was on May 18, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
