## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by the Tribal Attorney that Section 1003 of Ordinance No. 129, otherwise known as the Removal and Exclusion Ordinance should be amended to clarify that any non-member who commits a Federal or State crime on the reservation or who commits a crime which would be a violation of the Tribal Criminal Code if committed by a member of the Tribe shall be consitute grounds for exclusion and removal, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney further advises the Tribal Council that already existing sections of the ordinance provide for a remedy to exclude persons for committing State or Federal crimes on the reservation, specially 1003 (1) (a) (b), but that this proposed section will further clarify the ordinance, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the proposed amendment which is attached hereto by reference should be posted for ten (10) days for public comment as required by the Tribal Constitution.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the attached proposed amendment to Ordinance No. 129 be posted for the requisite ten (10) days as required by the Tribal Constitution.

The foregoing resolution was on August 10, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i & (q) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
