

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to quality behavioral health, social and judicial services for its members, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is built upon the strengths of its component family units, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes that therapeutic counseling services to troubled Apache families will further strengthen the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe further recognizes the need to remove juvenile offenders from the adult jail and to coordinate therapeutic services to such juveniles and their families, and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Child Welfare Act, P.L. 95-608, Title II, provides for the department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, to provide grants to tribes for said tribes to provide such services, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council authorizes the Tribal Chairman to negotiate and execute such grants and/or any amendments, and
- WHEREAS, the authority granted under this resolution to the Tribal Chairman is to run concurrent with the term of the grant.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it requests from the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs, a grant to the Community Development Corporation to be utilized as applied for by the Families at Risk Program and the White Mountain Apache Tribal Youth Service Center.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the grant is to commence on July 01, 1984 and is to be administered through the Community Development Corporation by the Tribal Guidance Center and the Youth Service Center.

The foregoing resolution was on December 14, 1983 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
