## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mrs. Cora Duryea has come before the Tribal Council for permission to dedicate the World Evangelist Church as the East Fork Community Church with a congregation of approximately thirty (30) adults, and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Cora Duryea advises the Tribal Council that the East Fork Community Church will be established on her property, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after discussion with Mrs. Duryea, concludes that permission should be granted to the World Evangelist Church so that they may dedicate their church to be known as the East Fork Community Church on the premises of Mrs. Cora Duryea.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby recognizes the establishment of the East Fork Community Church now known as the World Evangelist Church on the premises of Mrs. Cora Duryea, an enrolled member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on January 12, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
