## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mrs. Jennie Palmer, a tribal member, has requested permission from the Tribal Council to remove salvageable lumber from the old Tribal quarters approximately two miles south of Williams Creek Girls Camp for purposes of using said lumber to construction a suitable home for her children who are in need of housing, and
- WHEREAS, Mrs. Palmer advised the Tribal Council that all the doors, windows and plumbing fixtures have been removed from the quarters and that only the frame and sidings remains, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that Mrs. Jennie Palmer's request should be granted and that she should be given permission to remove any salvageable lumber that she can use for a home for her children.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants permission to tribal member, Jennie Palmer, to remove any salvageable lumber from the old Tribal quaters located south of Williams Creek Girls Camp for the purpose of using said lumber for the construction of a shelter for her children.

The foregoing resolution was on January 11, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
