RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mr. Marcelo Minjarez and Ms. Delphine Beatty, present employees of the Apache Development Enterprise, have come before the Tribal Council and have complained about maltreatment and isolation from their former duties and responsibilities as employees of the Development Enterprise, and
- WHEREAS, they further advise the Tribal Council that although a previous Council resolution restored them to their former positions, they have not been given any work to do as previously required by those former positions by the General Manager, Bill Morgan and that therefore, they are receiving a salary without performing any work for the Enterprise, and
- WHEREAS, Marcelo Minjarez and Delphine Beatty further advise the Tribal Council that they do not wish to be paid for work they do not perform, but that presently they have been isolated and ignored by the General Manager and thereofre cannot perform any work for their pay, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the prior resolution restoring
 Marcelo Minjarez and Delphine Beatty to their former positions with
 the Development Enterprise implied that they should continue as working
 employees of the Enterprise and further that it is not in the best
 interests of the Tribe to pay workers without receiving a work product.
- BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the General Manager, Bill Morgan to return Marcelo Minjarez and Delphine Beatty to their former positions and assign to them the previous responsibilities and duties they were required to perform prior to their suspension.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests the Office of the Tribal Chairman to conduct a followup of compliance with this directive.

The foregoing resolution was on January 11, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
