RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs rebuild Route 61; Diamond Creek Road, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way, 100 feet in width; beginning at the terminal point of Project F.A.I.R. 61 (3), Resolution No. 83-153, a distance of 3.252 miles in length, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that prior to this resolution, a fair amount of timber has been cut and possible damage suffered by the land area comprising the proposed Right-of-Way and that damages may possibly be assessed against the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous Right-of-Way as recorded on a map on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona, to which reference is hereby made.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no fencing of the Right-of-Way take place on this section of Route 61.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby reserves any claims that the Tribe may be entitled to against the Bureau of Indian Affairs for damages to the area comprising the Right-of-Way area pursuant to the applicable Federal Statutes and Regulations.

The foregoing resolution was on January 12, 1984 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
